Department of Economics Library Collection Development Policy

I. General Statement of Collection Development Policy

The Collection supports the present and anticipated research and teaching needs of faculty and students in the Department of Economics as well as the Wake Forest University community.

II. Description of the College Program

The department offers a B.A. in Economics, and in conjunction with the mathematics department, a B.S. in Mathematical Economics. Entry-level courses in economics help satisfy the divisional requirement in the social sciences.

III. Interdisciplinary Elements of Subject Area

Materials purchased with the library budget for Economics may also support various majors, minors and interdisciplinary programs such as sociology, business, accountancy, entrepreneurship and social enterprise, women's and gender studies, American ethnic studies, as well as the Master of Arts in Liberal Studies.

IV. Formats and Types of Materials

Scholarly monographs, journals, and reference works are the primary emphasis of the collection. A limited number of popular monographs and periodicals are also purchased. When available the purchase of materials in other formats (i.e. DVD, microform, other audiovisual) will be explored and considered as interest, price, and equipment considerations allows. Except in rare instances only one format of a specific source will be collected.

V. Languages

English is the primary language of the collection. Some foreign language materials are purchased but preference is given to English translations of these materials.

VI. Geographic Areas (Subject Approach)

The primary focus of the collection is the economics literature of the United States and other developed economies, with additional coverage of developing economies. Other geographic areas will be collected according to student and faculty study and research need. Statistical information on economics is collected on an international basis.

VII. Time Periods (Subject Approach)

Primary emphasis is placed on information and research on the current state of economics, while information of a historical nature is collected to a lesser extent.

VIII. Dates of Publication

Preference is given to current or new publications. Retrospective collection will supplement the acquisition process as need dictates and budgetary constraints allow.

IX. Subject Area and Level of Collecting Intensity

Collecting intensity designations should reflect the Department's present and anticipated curriculum, and should be at levels that enable the Department to implement its academic program.
